Palau is a group of islands in the western Pacific, north of New Guinea and east of the Philippines. While it is best known for its marine life, Palau is home to nearly 100 species of orchids. Benjamin J. Crain is working with the Palau Orchid Conservation Initiative

to study these orchids and their ecology, including relationship their mycorrhizal with fungi, and develop plans for conservation and restoration of the species and their habitats.

research ecologist at the Smithsonian. He has been working with rare plants for more than 25 years. His botanical research has taken him from the islands of Micronesia to the tundra of northern Alaska to the cloud forests of Costa Rica to study the effects of environmental change on plant communities.

Your membership dues for 2023 are due by March 31. If you have already paid, thank you.



For the rest of you, if we don't receive your dues by March 31, we have to drop you from our membership list. Please don't make us do that!


Dues are still only \$20 for individual membership or \$25 for family membership. Please fill out the form on page 5 and mail it in with your payment (address is on the form). Thanks!

Hilo Orchid Society 2022 Financials

At the February meeting, Treasurer Rick Kelley presented these charts to summarize how we did financially in 2022. As you can see, we did very well! The area of each pie chart surrounded by black shows the income and expenses for the Hilo Orchid Show. The show accounts for the lion's share of both our income and expenses. Overall expenses were unusually low in 2022, partly because we did not award any scholarships, so expenses are expected to be higher in 2023.
